

GREAT MULTITUDES FOLLOWED JESUS AND HE HEALED THEM ALL

Matthew 12:15 KJV

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Jesus went forth, and saw a great multitude, and was moved with compassion toward them, and He healed their sick. *Matthew 14:14.*

And great multitudes came unto Him, (Jesus), having with them those that were lame, blind, dumb, maimed and many others, and cast them down at Jesus' feet, and He healed them. *Matthew 15:30.*

This truth is stated eight times in Matthew's Gospel. *Matthew 4:24, (8:3), 8:16, (9:6), 9:35, 12:15, 14:14, 14:35,36, 15:30,31, 19:2.*

Jesus healed all those who came to Him and followed Him.

Jesus commanded the twelve apostles to do the same. *Matthew 10:1, 7, 8, Luke 9:1, 2, 6.*

Jesus commanded the seventy disciples to do the same. *Luke 10:1, 9, 17, 18, 19.*

The early Church did the same. *Acts 5:16, Acts 6:8, Acts 8:7, Acts 14:10, Acts 20:9,10, Acts 28:8,9.*

And Jesus has told us to do the same. *Mark 16:17-20.*

Jesus said, "If I do not the works of My Father, then don't believe Me." *John 10:37.*

"But if I do, though you do not believe Me, believe the works: that you may know, and believe, that the Father is in Me, and I in Him." *John 10:38.*

Jesus said, "the Son can do nothing of Himself, but what He sees the Father do: for what things soever He does, these also the Son does likewise." *John 5:19.*

"The Father loves the Son and shows Him all things that He is doing." *John 5:20.*

Jesus said, "I can, of My own self do nothing." *Johns 5:30.*

Jesus said, "I do nothing of Myself; but as My Father has taught Me, I speak these things," *John 8:28.*

Jesus said, "I have not spoken of Myself, (My own authority, KJV margin), but the Father which sent Me, He gave me a commandment, what I should say, and what I should speak." *John 12:49.*

Jesus said, "The words I speak unto you, I speak not of Myself, (My own authority, KJV margin), but the Father that dwells in Me, He does the works." *John 14:10.*

Jesus did not speak on His own authority, or act on His own authority. Jesus only said what the Father gave Him to say, and only did what the Father showed Him to do, or told Him to do. **Therefore we conclude that the Father was willing, for every sick person, of the multitudes that Jesus healed, to be healed.**

Of all the persons recorded in the Word, Jesus most perfectly represents and reveals the will of the Father in heaven. In fact Jesus is perfect theology. We conclude that it is the will of the Father, to heal all who come to Jesus, believe in Jesus, and follow Jesus.

There is no record in the Word of God that Jesus ever said to a person, "It is not the will of the Father for you to be healed."

Jesus is the highest revelation of God to mankind, of God's Word and God's will. *Hebrews 1:1-3.*

He is true God and true man. *Titus 2:13, John 8:58, 1Timothy 2:5.*

He is God with us. *Matthew 1:23.*

If we see something in God's Word that does not line up with what Jesus taught and did, then what Jesus taught and did is what we are to believe as the perfect will of God. *Matthew 5:21,27,31,33,38,43, Luke 9:51-56.*

Jesus is the way, **the truth** and the life. *John 14:6.*

Sometimes a person can take a Scripture like *2Timothy 4:20*, where it says, "Trophimus have I left at Miletum sick," as an argument against the truth that it is God's will to heal all who come to Jesus for healing. What Jesus said and did is the perfect expression of the will of God and carries the highest authority.
